

Sons and Daughters: 1 Corinthians 11:2-16

August 20, 2017

This passage is the first of three in which Paul challenges the Corinthian believers in regard to their corporate gatherings (church services). He begins with discussing head coverings, and will to address the Lord's Supper, and finally the abuse of spiritual gifts.

Read 1 Corinthians 11:2-16. What are some of the things that stick out to you?

What behaviors of the Corinthian believers are sending mixed messages? How so?

Some might say the Corinthian church was known more for 'being distracted' than 'being devoted.' As we've learned about the Corinthians Church, do you agree or disagree with that statement?

What mixed messages can we, as individuals, give that confuse the people we are trying to reach? As the American Church?

Paul calls believers to live lives that glorify God by reflecting who he is (read Genesis 1:27 and 2 Corinthians 5:17). The challenge we all face is understanding and applying that in our own lives. What does it mean for you to glorify God? How do you reflect who He is? *(Leader tip: Press people on different aspects of the lives: personal devotion, family, finances, sexuality, work, play, etc)*
